The Community of Sant'Egidio began in Rome in 1968, in the period following the Second Vatican Council. Today it is a movement of lay people and has more than 40,000 members, dedicated to evangelisation and charity, in Rome, Italy and in more than 60 countries throughout the world. The Community of Sant' Egidio is a "Church public lay association". The different communities, spread throughout the world, share the same spirituality and principles which characterise the way of Sant'Egidio:

Prayer, Communicating the Gospel, Solidarity with the poor, Ecumenism, and Dialogue, recommended by Vatican II as a way of peace and co-operation among the religions, and also a way of life and as a means of resolving conflicts. The Community has as its centre the Roman Church of Sant' Egidio, from which the Community takes its name. From its very beginnings, the Community has maintained, in the area of Trastevere and in Rome, a continuous presence of prayer and welcome for the poor and for pilgrims.

The Thomas More Centre, situated in North Melbourne, is an organisation proudly promoting Christian Social principles to the wider Community through Social Action Groups, University work and Christian Education.
